Soup Supper & Transition Team Community Conversation January 18, Thursday, 6:00 p.m.



Council Corner - December 2017

Visitors included the Rev. Gail Robb, our transitional liaison from the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area, newly elected Council members Tomie Evans and Susan Strebig who will start their time on Council in January of 2018, and Lynne Bates who reported on church finances.



Pastor Robb reviewed the process of the Mission Study that the Pastoral Transition Team and the entire church will embark on in the next few months. The survey taken in November is a part of this process. The study will culminate in the election of a Pastoral Nominating Committee (PNC) which will search for a new called pastor.

The Pastoral Transition Team will hold a Community Conversation and Soup Supper at 6 p.m. on Thursday, January 18 at church. All members and friends are encouraged to attend. The goal is to hear from community leaders, business people, and neighbors about the needs and strengths of the community Cherokee Park United shares and serves.


Council has approved and forwarded a "Creation Care and Healing Conversations" Overture to the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area to encourage all PCUSA congregations to advocate for action on climate. If approved by the Presbytery at its January meeting and at least one other Presbytery, the Overture will be considered at the 223rd General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church USA in June.
